

## Copyright

Copyright protects original literary, dramatic, musical and artistic works, as well as non-literary written work, such as software, web content and databases. Limited copyright protection is available for industrial designs; if there is copyright in the design drawings, that copyright cannot be used to protect articles made to those drawings, unless they are designs of a typeface.

Copyright is not a registered right; it arises by operation of law as soon as a copyright work comes into existence.

As with unregistered design right, infringement occurs by way of copying, evidence of which may be difficult to obtain. Copying the whole or a substantial part of your work, including making an adaptation of your work and putting your work on the internet, are infringing acts.

In most cases, the term of UK copyright is the life of the author plus 70 years. Surface decoration on articles receives copyright protection for 25 years from marketing, as do articles exploited industrially where the articles are of "artistic craftsmanship" (e.g. crafted furniture), sculptures or items of architecture.
